

**Proceeding of the 27<sup>th</sup> Meeting of HP State Executive Committee (SEC) constituted under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 held on 8<sup>th</sup> December, 2025 at 03.30 PM in CS Committee Room, HP Secretariat, Shimla under the Chairmanship of Sh. Sanjay Gupta, Chief Secretary-cum- Chairman State Executive Committee, Himachal Pradesh.**

The following members of the State Executive Committee were present in the meeting:-

1. Sh Kamlesh Kumar Pant Addl Chief Secretary (Revenue to the GoHP.
2. Sh Devesh Kumar Principal Secretary (Finance and PWD) to the GoHP.

At the outset, the Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue) to the Government of Himachal Pradesh, Sh. Kamlesh Kumar Pant welcomed the Chief Secretary-cum-Chairman, SEC, all the members of SEC, and other officers who were present in the meeting. Thereafter, the Director-cum- Ex Officio Special Secretary (Rev-DM) to the GoHP, Shri DC Rana, presented the agenda to the SEC and SEC took up the agenda items for discussion. Record of discussion is as under:

The SEC was apprised that during the 2025 monsoon disaster the State experienced unprecedented and widespread devastation during the 2025 monsoon due to flash floods, cloudbursts, and landslides, resulting in the tragic loss of 468 human lives, and extensive damage to public and private infrastructure across all 12 districts. The State suffered a damage/loss amounting to Rs 5909 Crore during monsoon 2025 disaster and the Memorandum of Losses was sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI for sanction of funds under NDRF. During the monsoon 2023 disaster the State Government with the technical assistance of the National Disaster Management Authority had conducted the Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) which was assessed at Rs 9042 Crore. The Government of India has approved Rs 2006 Crore under PDNA for monsoon 2023 with 25% State Share. The GOI has released 1<sup>st</sup> Instalment of Rs 451.44 Crore which has been released alongwith State Share to the Departments/Districts.

The monsoon disaster 2025 also devastated livelihoods of the people of state, and overall economic impact of about 17,800 crores. On the request of the State Government, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) provided invaluable technical guidance and expert support for conducting this State-led PDNA. The exercise was conducted from 17th September to 30th November 2025 by multidisciplinary teams comprising State Government officers and NDMA-nominated sector experts. The PDNA 2025 estimates the total damage and loss at approximately ₹7,610.76 Crore, covering Social, Infrastructure, Productive, and Cross-Cutting Sectors, and the recovery need to the tune of 10,230.92 crores. The report provides a comprehensive assessment of impacts and formulates a detailed, climate-resilient Recovery Strategy aligned with the principles of 'Build Back Better' and risk-informed development.

← **Decision:-**

The State Executive Committee approved that the PDNA document for monsoon 2025 disaster be submitted to the Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI so that the State can get the funds under Recovery and Reconstruction window of NDRF at the earliest and the recovery and reconstruction work of the assets damaged during monsoon 2025 disaster can be started at the earliest.
